Alia Lootah: "In the Space of Becoming"

A Solo Exhibition Aisha Alabbar Gallery Dubai, UAE

Aisha Alabbar Gallery is pleased to present In the Space of Becoming, a solo exhibition by Alia Lootah, featuring a new body of work that brings together painting, drawing, and sculpture in a fluid and contemplative exploration of form, material, and transformation.

Rooted in the idea that "a form is never finished, only paused," Lootah's practice approaches form as something living, constantly shifting, stretching, collapsing, and re-emerging in altered states. Across the exhibition, shapes migrate between mediums, creating a shared visual language that resists fixed meaning and instead unfolds gradually through repetition, rhythm, and time.

At the heart of the exhibition are Lootah's sculptural works, many of which employ knitting as both method and metaphor. Far from a purely technical process, knitting becomes a meditative gesture, one shaped by memory, labor, and touch. The resulting forms are soft, pliant, and resistant to containment, often positioned against rigid pedestals that act as counterforces attempting to stabilize what is inherently in flux. This tension between softness and structure, control and release, mirrors the central dualities within her wider practice.

Everyday materials ground the works in lived experience, evoking the gestures of domestic labor and the quiet rhythms of daily life. Yet the forms themselves remain open and unresolved, hovering between recognition and abstraction, intimacy and ambiguity. Meaning emerges slowly, asking the viewer to engage with patience and attentiveness rather than immediate clarity.

Lootah's paintings and drawings echo this sense of internal movement. Lines fold back on themselves, shapes fragment and reform, and gestures migrate across surfaces, reinforcing the dialogue between two-and three-dimensional space. Together, the works trace the evolution of form as it repeats, mutates, and subtly shifts depending on the material that holds it.

Speaking on the exhibition, Shilan Samaei, Gallery Director at Aisha Alabbar Gallery, notes:

"Alia's work exists in a quiet but powerful state of transformation. What moves me most is the way she allows form to remain open, unresolved, and alive. In a world that often demands immediacy and definition, her practice asks us to slow down, to observe carefully, and to trust in the beauty of becoming."

Ultimately, In the Space of Becoming is an invitation to reflect on transformation not as a dramatic rupture, but as a series of small, nearly imperceptible shifts. Through accumulated gestures and repeated acts, Lootah reveals change as something gentle, persistent, and deeply intertwined with time, attention, and care.

About the Artist

Alia Hussain Lootah (b. Dubai, 1987) is an Emirati artist, whose current work focuses on bodies of art with the theme of understanding the interpersonal relationship between mother and child in today's modern world. Uncertainty stems from both external and internal factors of unrest.

Alia has participated in multiple group and solo exhibition, such as: "Art be a part" in collaboration with Unicef India and Dubai cares at the Museum of the Future (Dubai,UAE), had a solo presentation at Art Dubai 2024, Madinat Jumeirah, Dubai, UAE (2024) and Abu Dhabi Art 2022, Aisha Alabbar Gallery, Manarat Al Saadiyat, Abu Dhabi, UAE (2022). She has participated in several exhibitions including Dubai Calligraphy Biennale (2023); The Quest, Aisha Alabbar Gallery, Dubai, UAE (2022); Sikka Art Fair, Dubai, UAE (2011, 2012, and 2013); Mawtini, Tashkeel, Dubai, UAE (2013); Metamorphosis, Tashkeel, Dubai, UAE (2013); and 40 Poems from the Desert, The Ara Gallery, Dubai, UAE (2011). Alia participated as one of the first artists in the Salama bint Hamdan Emerging Artist Fellowship Program (SEAF), graduating in 2014. Her SEAF thesis focused on exploring motherhood through different forms of sculptures. In 2017, Alia co-founded the Medaf Studio in Dubai, an art centre aimed at introducing children and adults to art as a form of self-expression and creativity.
